 Course Title: International Course on the Clinical and Programmatic Management of Drug-Resistant Tuberculosis

2. Dates and Location: five-day in-person session from the 13-17 October 2025 in Taipei (Taiwan)

## 5. Introduction

The International Course on the Clinical Management of Drug-Resistant Tuberculosis is a five-day inperson course aiming to strengthen participants' capacity in the clinical and programmatic management of drug-resistant tuberculosis.

It includes pre-disposing online content with on-demand videos and quizzes. The online materials are optional, but recommended, and will be available from the <u>Union Courses</u> platform (internet connection is required to access them).

This course is being organized by The Union in partnership with Wan Fang Hospital, Taipei Medical University and Taiwan Anti-Tuberculosis Association.

#### 6. Target audience

This course is designed for clinicians, who are responsible for diagnosis and treatment of drug-resistant tuberculosis, staff of national tuberculosis programmes and technical partners, working in tuberculosis care and prevention, in low- and middle-income countries, especially in settings where programmatic management of drug-resistant tuberculosis (PMDT) had been or is going to be implemented.

### 7. Objectives

At the end of this course, participants will be able to:

- Describe the current global epidemiological situation of drug-resistant tuberculosis.
- Describe the different approaches for the detection and diagnosis of drug-resistant tuberculosis.
- Address the principles of treatment and regimen design, according to different patterns of drug-resistance.
- Review key second line and new anti-tuberculosis medicines
- Discuss common problems and possible solutions for programmatic management of drugresistant tuberculosis.
