# EUROPE'S LUNG HEALTH EXPERTS DISCUSS CHALLENGES AND SHARE LATEST RESEARCH AT PARIS CONFERENCE

44<sup>th</sup> Union World Conference on Lung Health is taking place at the Palais des Congrès in Paris from 30 October-3 November 2013

**31 October 2013/ Paris, France** – A week after the World Health Organization reported that Europe and Africa are the two regions not on track to meet tuberculosis mortality and prevalence targets, leading European lung health experts will gather in Paris for the 44<sup>th</sup> Union World Conference on Lung Health. Held annually by the International Union Against Tuberculosis and Lung Disease (The Union), the conference draws delegates from 125 countries to address lung health issues including the threats posed by TB and multidrug-resistant TB, air pollution, tobacco control, and asthma.

Europe continues to be a hot spot for multidrug- and extensively drug-resistant TB, according to the WHO Global TB Report 2013 released in London last week. A further disturbing trend is that only 48% of these difficult-to-treat TB cases are detected worldwide. Other issues for Europe that will be discussed are the rate of childhood asthma and progress towards tobacco control. Highlights include:

## TB and MULTIDRUG-RESISTANT TUBERCULOSIS (MDR-TB)

- "DR-TB Drugs under the Microscope": Médecins Sans Frontières and The Union will launch the 3<sup>rd</sup> edition of this important report on Wednesday, 30 October 2013 (09:00-10:00, Room 234–235, Palais des Congrès)
- "The Challenge of MDR-TB: Globally, in Europe and in France" will be the subject of a press conference on Wednesday, 30 October 2013 (12:45–13:45, Room 242B, Palais des Congrès). English/French/English translation will be provided. Speakers will include:

- Researchers from seven countries will present their latest research and experiences in a
  half-day workshop "Health systems in transition: TB control in the countries of the
  former Soviet Union" on Thursday, 31 October (09:00–12:00, Room 251, Palais des
  Congrès). English/Russian/English translation will be provided.
- Results of a European multi-centre study of the limitations of a diagnostic test for latent TB infection will be presented at a symposium on Saturday, 02 November 2013 (08:00 -10:00, Room 243, Palais des Congrès).
- A computer model developed by the London School of Tropical Medicine and other
  partners in The Union's TREAT TB initiative that uses virtual implementation to help with
  decision-making and scale-up of new TB diagnostic tools will be presented at "Can new
  diagnostic tools reduce the time to appropriate treatment initiation?" on Saturday, 2
  November 2013 (14:30–16:30, Amphithéâtre Bleu, Palais des Congrès). Results of

- research evaluating the efficacy of line probe assays, conducted in the prisons and civil sector of Arkhangelsk, Russia will also be presented at this session.
- A UK project providing social support for patients with TB in London will be presented at the symposium "Strategies for social support" on Saturday, 02 November 2013(14:30–16:30, Room 241, Palais des Congrès).
- Use of Xpert MTB/RIF in mobile X-ray units to test homeless people in the UK for TB will be featured at "Communities with a heavy burden of TB imposed by poverty and marginalisation" on Sunday, 03 November 2013 (14:00–16:00, Room 241, Palais des Congrès).

#### AIR POLLUTION AND LUNG HEALTH

- "Air Pollution and Lung Health" will be the focus of a press conference on Thursday, 31
   October 2013 (12:45–13:45, Room 234–235 M, Palais des Congrès). This event will

## **TOBACCO CONTROL AND SECOND-HAND SMOKE**

- UK-based projects designed to measure exposure to second-hand smoke in the home and car will be featured in the symposium, "Reducing second-hand smoke exposure in the home" on Friday, 01 November 2013 (08:00–10:00, Room 253, Palais des Congrès)
- Behaviour change studies from Belgium and the UK will be presented in the symposium "Educational and behaviour change approaches towards tobacco control" on Friday, 01 November 2013 (14:30–16:30, Room 253, Palais des Congrès).

"People tend to be less aware of their lung health than of other health indicators, such as weight and blood pressure", says José Luis Castro, Interim Executive Director of The Union. "But lung health is essential to life, and every country needs to be prepared to manage airborne infections like MDR-TB, as well as to be vigilant in providing protection again the far-reaching negative health impacts of air pollution and tobacco use".
